October 6, 2024:

The Hotel Paradise Orchestra*

Back for the 5th year! This 1920s-style 12-piece big band plays hot jazz, early swing, and gently sweet melodies by Cole Porter, Irving Berlin, Jerome Kern, Duke Ellington, Jelly Roll Morton, the Gershwins, Baltimore's Eubie Blake, Cab Calloway, and more. Janet Paulsen, vocalist. Jari Villanueva, musical director.

October 20, 2024:

"The Divine Comedy of Dante Alighieri by Cesare San Fiorenzo and his friendship with Giuseppe Verdi"* Elena Buttiero & Anita Frumento, piano four hands from Italy.

A research study in the musicological field led pianists Buttiero and Frumento to discover the score "The Divine Comedy for Piano Four Hands" by Cesare San Fiorenzo. The score, forgotten for more than 100 years, offers extraordinary and evocative melodies very close to the operatic world of the great composer Giuseppe Verdi. The two musicians developed a strong bond of friendship and often met in the city of Genoa. The program includes some original transcriptions from the 1800's of Opera arias by Verdi taken from La Traviata and Il Trovatore.

Celebrating its 33rd anniversary, CHS Steel performs repertoire that covers many different styles, from classical to jazz and rock. In over 20 concerts every year, the band shares the music and the "sound" of Trinidad and Tobago with audiences throughout the Maryland region.
